Description of Proposed Use

Progressive Contracting Inc. has several mining claims located in Modena Canyon adjacent to the Modena Canyon Road which is also known as Hamblin Valley Road. The location of these claims is identified by the legal description provided in the General Land Use Application.

According to the Iron County zoning map the subject property is currently zoned Agriculture 20. This zoning allows for Surface Mining with the requirement of a Conditional Use Permit.

Through our own exploration and material sampling efforts we have located a substantial deposit of Volcanic Pozzolan in the described location.

Pozzolan is used in the production of Concrete and is becoming more and more useful with the closure of many of the coal fired electrical plants that is taking place throughout the country. These coal fired plants produce Fly ash which is currently used as a component in the production of concrete. Pozzolan is a natural source of material that was created as a result of volcanic activity and is very similar to Fly ash. As the supply of Fly ash decreases with the closing of power plants the cost and availability of Fly ash is becoming a concern and cement producers are looking to Pozzolan as a more cost efficient alternative.

PCI has determined that there is a market for this material and is working with the BLM and the Utah State Division of Gas, Oil, and Mining, to secure a permit to mine these claims.

Our intention is to mine and process the material at the described location and load it onto trucks to haul it either to a rail site in Cedar City or truck directly to our customers, depending on location.

The processing of this material will require the clearing of the property and excavation of the Pozzolan. The raw material would then be crushed to the required specifications and loaded on the trucks.

Production will be based on the quantity of orders we are able to secure for the material. Therefore, it is difficult to accurately estimate the number of loads that will be hauled daily from the site. We anticipate in the beginning we will haul between 10 and 20 loads per day. This number will be subject to change depending on the available market for the material. The main impact of our operation will be on the Modena Canyon Road. PCI will be executing a Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU) with Iron County for the purpose of describing each parties' obligations for the improvement and maintenance of the Modena Canyon Road during the time that PCI is a operating the mine. An unsigned copy of this MOU is included with this application.

We will use dozers to clear the property and to remove any overburden and to assist in the excavation of the material. Excavators will be used to excavate and sort the material and load onto rock trucks to haul to the crusher site. We anticipate using a Jaw Crusher and an Impact Crusher to size the material. Front end loaders will be used to feed the crushers and radial stacking belts will be used to stockpile the material once it has been processed.

Our plan is to only disturb the land as necessary to meet the requirements of production. Once we have completed mining in an area, we will reclaim the land per our requirements and bond with the BLM.

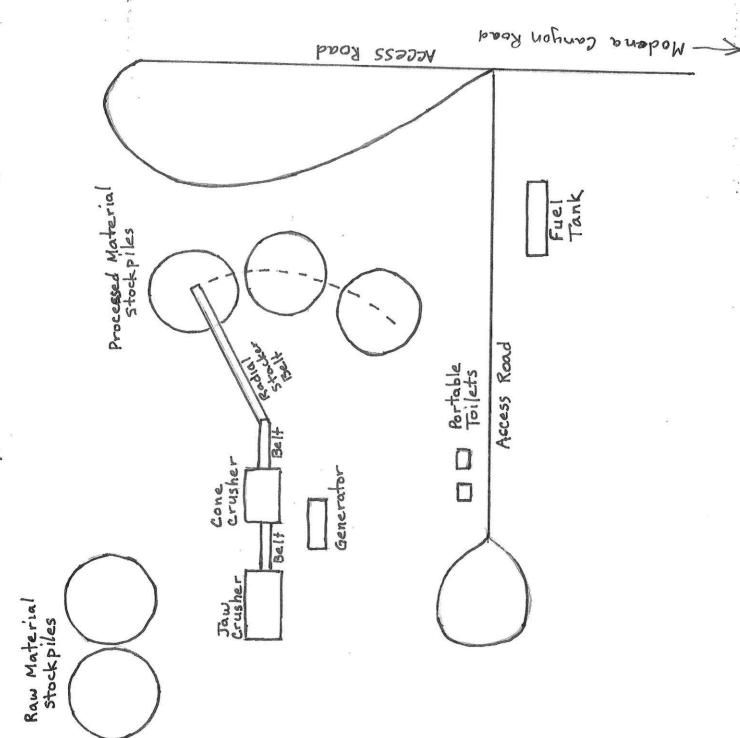
Water for dust control on Modena Canyon Road and the proposed crushing operation will be provided through an agreement with a local ranch.

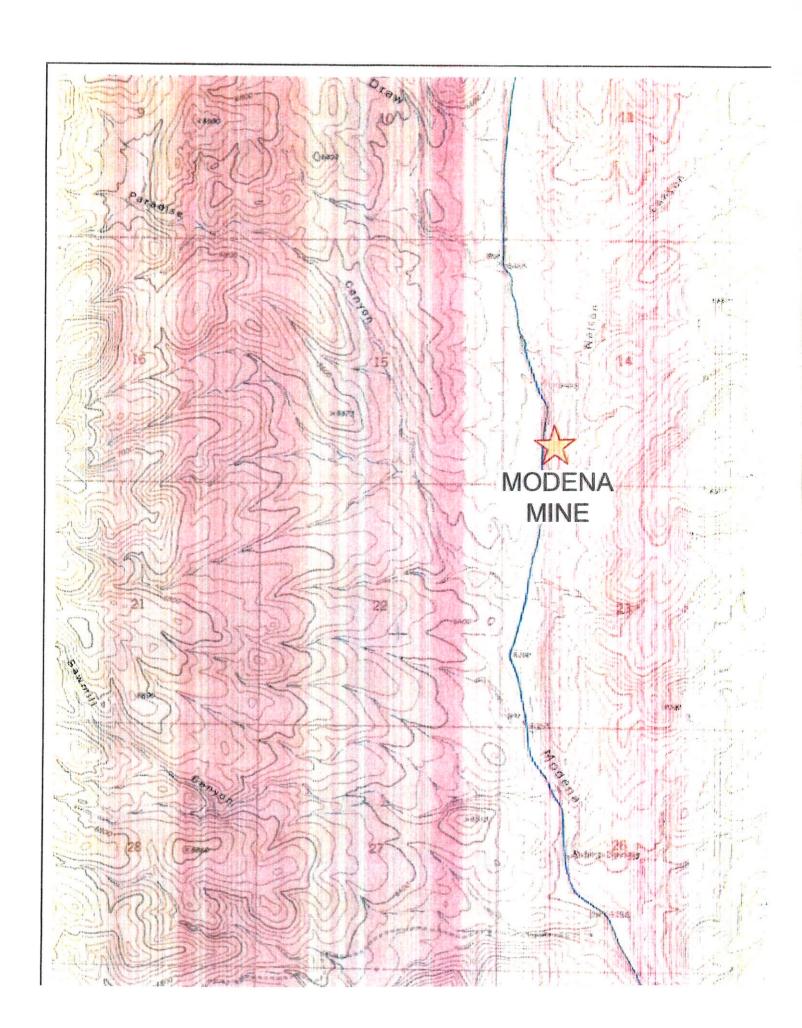
We do not anticipate constructing any permanent structures on the site. We will use loader scales to monitor the weight of loads but do not anticipate the use of permanent scales or a scale house at the site. Certified weighing of the material will be done at our site in Cedar City.

We will use Porta-Potty's for sanitary purposes and bottled water for the use of employees.

It is anticipated that we will have between 7 to 10 employees at the site and our work hours will typically be 7:00 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday. If necessary to meet production requirements, these hours may be increased to include weekends.

Due to the size of the site and the nature of mining operations it is not feasible to provide a site plan as all operations will be subject to frequent moves as material is mined. We have attached a schematic of a typical crushing operation layout.

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IV. OPERATION AND RECLAMATION PRACTICES (Rules R647-2-107, 108, and 109)

An exploration site is required to be kept in a clean and safe condition. Upon completion of exploration, the land is to be reclaimed to a useful condition with at least 70 percent of the original vegetative ground cover. To accomplish this, the Permittee / Operator will need to do the following work where applicable:

- Keep the exploration site in a safe, clean, and environmentally stable condition.
- Permanently seal all shafts and tunnels to prevent unauthorized or accidental entry.
- Plug drill holes with a five foot cement surface plug. Holes that encounter fluids are to be plugged in the subsurface to prevent aquifer contamination, in accordance with R647-2-108.
- 4. Construct berms, fences, or barriers, when needed, above highwalls and excavations.
- Remove, isolate, or neutralize all toxic materials in a manner compatible with federal and state regulations.
- 6. Remove all waste or debris from stream channels.
- 7. Dispose of any trash, scrap metal, wood, machinery, and buildings.
- 8. Conduct exploration activities so as to minimize erosion and control sediment.
- 9. Reclaim all roads that are not part of a permanent transportation system.
- 10. Remove and store suitable soil material where practical so it is available for reclamation.
- 11. Stabilize highwalls by backfilling or rounding to 45 degrees or less, where feasible; reshape the land to near its original contour, and redistribute the topsoil and suitable overburden.
- 12. Properly prepare seed bed to a depth of six inches by pocking, ripping, discing, or harrowing. Leave the surface rough.
- Reseed disturbed areas with adaptable species. The Division recommends a mixture of species of grass, forb, and browse seed, and will provide a specific species list if requested.
- Plant the seed with a rangeland or farm drill, or broadcast seed. Fall is the preferred time to seed.

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VI. SURETY (Utah Code Ann. §40-8-7(1)[c])

A reclamation contract and surety must be provided to and approved by the Division prior to commencement of operations. No surface disturbance is authorized until the surety is posted and approved in writing. The surety may be provided in the form of a certificate of deposit, a letter of credit, a surety bond, or cash. Please contact the Division for further information about submitting the surety. All mining and exploration operations are required to furnish and maintain reclamation surety to guarantee that the land affected is reclaimed (Utah Code Ann. §40-8-7(1)[c]).

The reclamation surety amount is based on the nature, extent and duration of operations. The amounts are based on data from current large mine sureties and are used as a general guide, along with actual site conditions. Reclamation sureties for exploration operations are projected into the future one year based on a cost index, and an extension of the exploration notice will require a review of the surety amount. Please contact the Division for further information about the amount required.

VII. PERMIT FEE (Utah Code Ann. §40-8-7(1)(i))

A permittee's authorization under a notice of intention to conduct exploration operations shall require the paying of permit fees as authorized by the Utah Legislature (R647-2-102.5). Permit fees are assessed to <u>new and existing</u> exploration operations, and annually thereafter, until the project disturbances are successfully reclaimed and released by the Division.

Exploration Notices require a \$150.00 fee, which must accompany this application, or the Division cannot process it.

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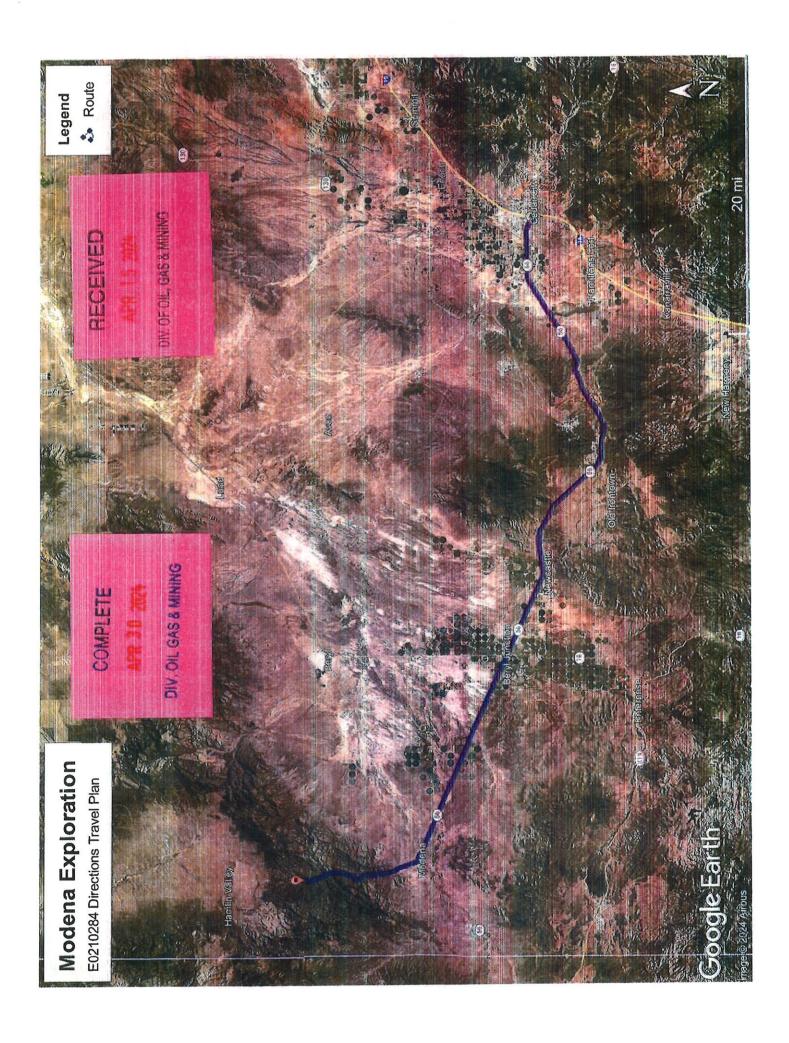

The referenced Notice of Intention to Commence Small Mining Operations (NOI) received on October 15, 2024, is complete with the exception of the reclamation contract, reclamation bonding requirement and concurrence from The Bureau of Land Management (BLM). The required reclamation surety for the planned 20 acres of disturbance is \$229,400. This amount was determined based on approved per-acre bond amounts and other information in the following table:

Tentative approval is being issued with the condition that the BLM findings from The National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) have been completed and concur on the bond amount. Once the final amount is determined, you will be required to submit that amount before receiving final approval.

The reclamation surety can be submitted in the form of an irrevocable letter of credit, a certificate of deposit, cash or a surety bond. A cash surety must be accompanied by a W9 form for domestic companies or a W8 form for foreign companies or the money will not be accepted as a surety and will be returned. The W9 and W8 forms are available on the Internal Revenue Service web site at https://www.irs.gov/. 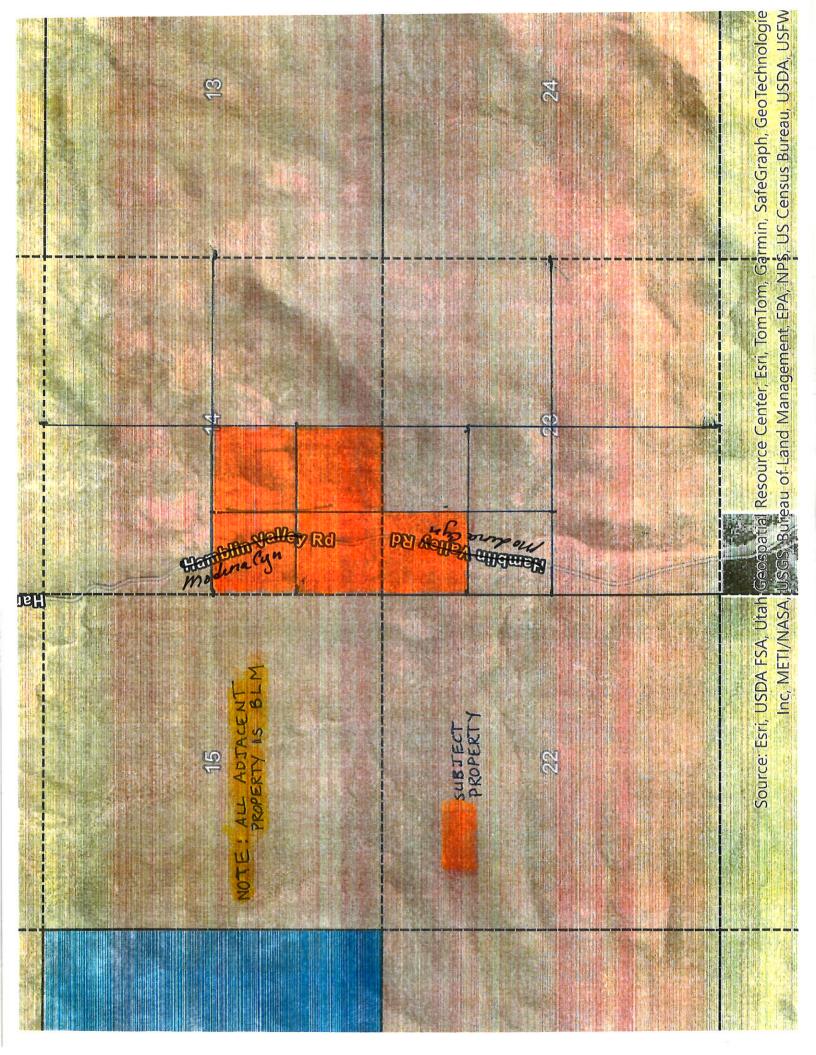

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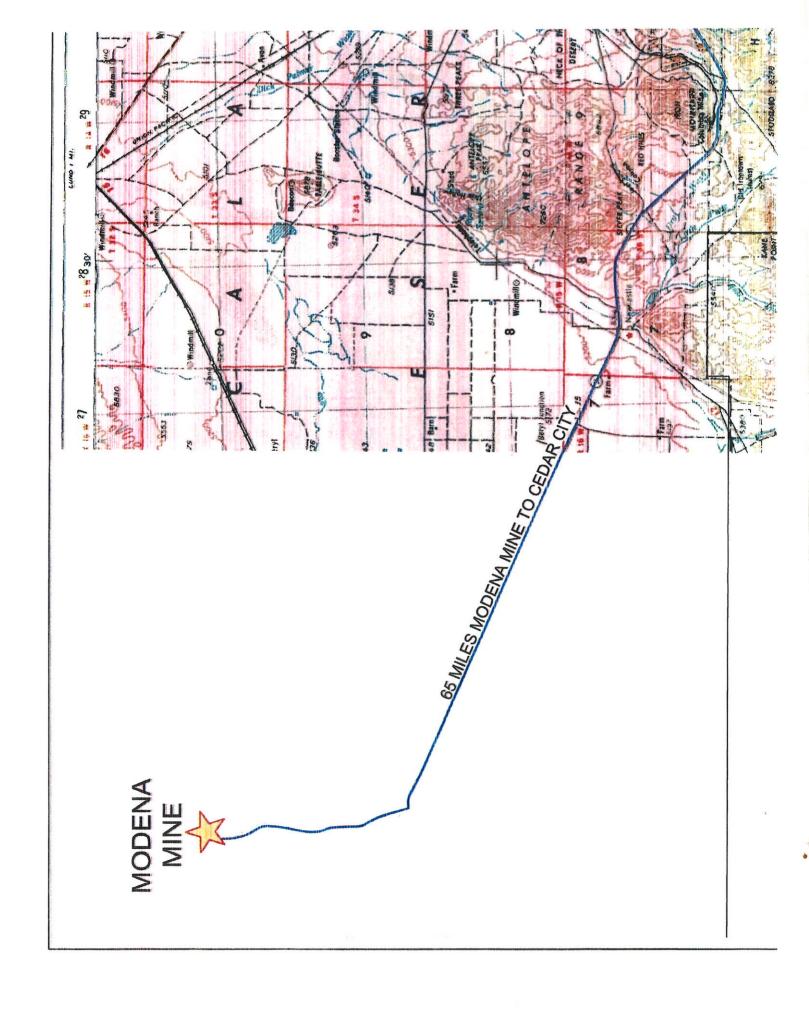

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR ROAD MAINTENANCE

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ("MOU") is entered into by and among **Iron County ("COUNTY")** and **PCI CONSTRUCTION ("PCI")** (collectively referred to as the "Parties" or individually as a "Party").

Based upon the mutual promises and conditions contained herein, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. **PURPOSE**. The purpose of this MOU is to provide for the use, improvement and maintenance of Modena Canyon Road, also known as Hamlin Valley Road, (hereafter referred to as the "Road") during PCI operations of the Modena Canyon Mine, while also keeping the Road in good working condition for the general use of the public in keeping with the obligations of the COUNTY for oversight of a Title V road.
- 2. **CONSIDERATION**. The consideration for this MOU consists of the mutual benefits and exchange of promises provided herein, the sufficiency of which is acknowledged by the Parties by execution of this MOU.
- 3. **LOCATION**. The location of the Road served by this MOU is the Modena Canyon or Hamlin Valley Road, located in western Iron County, which is a gravel road, beginning at Hwy 56 and continuing for approximately 9 miles to the Modena Canyon Mine entrance, and continuing an additional 200 yards north of the mine entrance.
- 4. **PCI OBLIGATIONS**. As part of this MOU, PCI agrees to undertake the following obligations with respect to the Road:
 - a. Improve and maintain the Road to 30 feet wide with appropriate gravel depth, low water crossings, culverts and/or bridges;
 - b. All improvements to the Road will remain within the 66 foot County right-of-way and to COUNTY standards;
 - c. Supply all gravel for the Road improvements;
 - d. Manage and maintain dust control during improvement, maintenance and use;
 - e. Clean and remove debris for 1000 feet of creek on the east side of the Road in Section 23 of T33S R19W;
 - f. Improve and maintain drainage along the Road;
 - g. Remove snow and do general maintenance and upkeep due to weather erosion and as needed
 - h. Provide a bond for the Road, which bond shall be renewed, as agreed by the Parties,

after the initial Term of this MOU, as outlined in Paragraph 7, and released one year after the conclusion of PCI operations or termination of this MOU.

- 5. **COUNTY OBLIGATIONS**. As part of this MOU, the COUNTY agrees to undertake the following obligations with respect to the Road:
 - a. Supply cattle guards for PCI use as PCI makes improvements to the Road;
 - Grant permissions to PCI to conduct Road maintenance as outlined during PCI operations;
 - c. Upon the closure of Modena Canyon Mine and conclusion of PCI operations, COUNTY will resume maintenance of the Road in keeping with the historic COUNTY standards for maintenance of the Road.
- 6. **INDEMNIFICATION**. Subject to the terms of the Immunity Act, it is mutually agreed that the Parties are each responsible for their own negligent, reckless, or intentional acts or omissions which are committed by them or their agents, officials or employees. No Party shall assume the liability of or indemnify or agree to defend any persons other than those specifically enumerated in statute. PCI agrees that if it believes it has been made a party to a suit as a result of the negligence of COUNTY, it will file a Notice of Claim in accordance with Utah law.
- 7. **TERM**. This MOU will continue for a period of five (5) consecutive years from the effective date, and the effective date will be considered the date when the Parties each execute this MOU. Once the initial term of five (5) years has expired, this agreement may be renewed upon the same terms for an additional five (5) years or more as agreed by the Parties.
- 8. **MOU TERMINATION**. This MOU may be terminated by either Party at any time with ninety (90) days written notice.
- 9. **LAWS OF UTAH**. It is understood and agreed by the Parties that this MOU will be governed by the laws of the State of Utah, both as to interpretation and performance. The forum for the resolution of any legal disputes that arise under this MOU will be located in the Third Judicial District, State of Utah
- 10. **SEVERABILITY OF PROVISIONS**. If any provision of this MOU is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder shall not be affected thereby.
- 11. **THIRD-PARTIES**. This MOU is not intended and should not be construed to benefit persons or other entities either not named as a Party herein or subsequently added as a Party pursuant to its provisions.
- 12. **TITLES AND CAPTIONS**. The titles and captions of this MOU are for convenience only and in no way define, limit, augment, extend, or describe the scope, content, or intent of any part or parts of this MOU.
 - 13. NON ASSIGNABILITY. No Party shall transfer or delegate any of their rights, duties,

powers or obligations under this MOU, without written consent of each of the other Parties.

- 14. **NOTICES**. All notices and other communications provided for in this MOU shall be in writing and will be sufficient for all purposes if: (a) sent by email to the address the Party may designate, or by fax to the fax number the Party may designate, and (concurrently) sent by first class mail to the Party and to the Party's legal office; (b) personally delivered; or (c) sent by certified or registered United States Mail addressed to the Party at the address the party may designate, return receipt requested.
- 15. **EXECUTION**. The Parties agree that both must execute this MOU by signing, acknowledging, and have their respective Attorney approve this MOU as to legality and form. Upon such execution of the MOU, all Parties will provide an original execution page.
- 16. **ENTIRE MOU; NO WAIVER**. This MOU represents the entire MOU among the Parties relating to its subject matter. This MOU alone fully and completely expresses the MOU of the Parties relating to its subject matter. There are no other courses of dealing, understanding, MOUs, representations or warranties, written or oral, except as specifically provided for in this MOU. This MOU may not be amended or modified, except by a written MOU signed by all Parties. No failure by any Party at any time to give notice of any breach by another Party of, or to require compliance with, any condition or provision of this MOU will be deemed a waiver of similar or dissimilar provisions or conditions at the same or at any prior or subsequent time.
- 17. The Parties hereto have executed this MOU as of the date indicated on each Party's execution page.
